The doors to the Ward Museum were closed from March 12 until July 21, and when it did open, there were restrictions to ensure everyone's safety. So, what could the Ward Foundation do to still celebrate the love for carving in the area it calls home?

The result was a hybrid in-person and online event. On Saturday, August 8, Ward Foundation staff, Ward Foundation Chair Rich Smoker and a limited number of volunteer judges floated decoys in tanks outside the Ward Museum. Nearly all of the day's proceedings were live-streamed on the Ward Museum's Facebook page for people to watch and get an up-close look at the birds. For the competition, the Ward Foundation accepted mail-in decoys from

across the country and had several local carvers stop by to drop off their decoys. Judges included local, award-winning carvers Arthur Leonard (Chincoteague, VA), Karl Yankey (Hummelstown, PA) and Russell Fish (Chincoteague, VA).

Everyone is hopeful that the 2021 Chesapeake Challenge will return to a more normal, in-person set-up this summer, so do us a favor and save the date: Saturday, August 14, 2021. Join us for the Delmarvalous Festival featuring the Chesapeake Challenge, hopefully in person — but even bigger and better online if needed. And in the meantime, stay safe and stay healthy, and keep carving!
